### **Opinion**

#### 1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **i BASIS OF PREPARATION**

- a The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015.
- b The Accounting policies have been consistently applied by the company and are consistent with those used in previous year.

#### ii Use of estimate

The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with Ind AS requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets, liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the end of the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future periods.

#### iii Property, plant and equipment and Depreciation / Amortization

#### a Property, plant and equipment

Fixed Assets are stated at purchase cost together with any incidental expenses on acquisition / installation and other expenses incurred for bringing the assets to the working condition for their intended use.

#### b Intangible assets

Intangible Assets are inclusive of the expenses incurred in production & installation of the Software.

#### c Depreciation and amortisation

An item of property, plant and equipment and any significant part initially recognised is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset) is included in the income statement when the asset is derecognised. The residual values, useful lives and methods of depreciation of property, plant and equipment are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted prospectively, if appropriate.

d Advances paid towards acquisition of fixed assets out-standing as at the Balance Sheet date and the cost of assets not ready to use before such date are disclosed under Capital Work in Progress and Advances.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

#### iv Impairment Of Assets

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal / external factors. An impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value at the weighted average cost of capital.

### v Income Tax

Tax expense comprises of current and deferred tax. Current income tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred income tax reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years.

Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. In situations where the Company has unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward tax losses, all deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that they can be realized against future taxable profits. At each balance sheet date the Company re-assesses un-recognized deferred tax assets.

#### vi Inventories

Inventories of raw material and packing material are valued at cost or net realizable value, whichever is lower. Cost is ascertain ed on First-in First out (FIFO) basis and includes all applicable costs incurred in bringing goods to their present location and condition.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less estimated cost of completion and estimated cost necessary to make the sale.

#### vii Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Service revenue is recognized on completion of services and where no significant uncertainty exists regarding the amount of the consideration that will be derived from rendering the services. Service revenue is net of service tax and represents the amount of consideration that will be derived from rendering the services.

#### viii Contingent Liabilities

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the Company or a present obligation that is not recognised because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also ari ses in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognised because it cannot be measured reliably. The Company does not recognise a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.

#### ix Retirement and Other Employee Benefits

- a. Retirement benefits in the form of Provident Fund are defined contribution schemes and the contributions are charged to the profit and loss account of the year when the contributions to the respective funds are due. There are no other obligations other than the contribution payable to the respective fund.
- b. Gratuity liability is defined benefit obligation and is provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year.
- c. Short term compensated absences are provided for based on estimates at the year end. Long term compensated absences are provided for based on actuarial valuation. The actuarial valuation is done at the end of each financial year as per projected unit credit method.
- d. Actuarial gains / losses are immediately taken to profit and loss account and are not deferred.
- e. Contribution to ESI is recognized and charged to the profit and loss account of the year.

#### x Borrowing Cost

Interest and other costs in connection with the borrowing of the funds to the extent related / attributed to the acquisition/construction of qualifying fixed assets are capitalized up to the date when such assets are ready for its intended use and other borrowing costs are charged to Profit & Loss  $A/c_+$ 

#### xi Provisions

A provision is recognized when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

#### xii Earning Per Share

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

#### xiii Foreign Currency Translation

#### a. Initial Recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

#### h Conversion

Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing rate. Non-monetary items which are carried in terms of historical cost denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction; and non-monetary items which are carried at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rates that existed when the values were determined.

#### c. Exchange Differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting company's monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year, or reported in previous financial statements, are recognized as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise.

Based on the aforesaid Joint Petition, the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Mumbai Bench have sanctioned the Scheme of Amalgamation and of Four Seasons Drycleaning Company Private Limited (Second Transferor Company) with Jyothy Fabricare Services Limited (the Transferee Company) vide their order dated February 16, 2021. Since the registered office of the First Transferor Company is in Bangalore, Karnataka, the Petition has been filed before the Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Bench, at Bangalore for seeking their approval to the said Amalgamation.
